

<p>Overview</p>	<p>The Pupil Premium is designed to ensure that funding to tackle disadvantage reaches the pupils who need it most. The funding is allocated to Local Authorities and schools with pupils from Reception to Year 11 who are eligible for free school meals (FSM), are looked after, or have parents currently in the Armed Forces.</p> <p>From April 2012 the coverage of the Premium was widened to include those eligible for FSM at any point in the last six years.</p> <p>From April 2015 the coverage of the Premium was widened to include those who have ever been looked after.</p>

Pupil premium children are identified and targeted for these activities where funding might before have prohibited access.</li> </ul> <p>Reception, Year One and Year Two received interventions for Reading and Numeracy.</p> <p>75% of Pupil Premium children achieved a 2B or better in Reading and 79.2% achieved a 2B or better in Numeracy. In Year One the Pupil Premium children's progress in Reading and Numeracy was in line with their peers. 64.7% of Pupil Premium children achieved a 1B or better in Reading 70.6% achieved a 1B or better in Numeracy. In reception 40% of Pupil Premium children achieved a Good Level of Development.</p>
