Please note: Bubble start times are the same *every* morning, Monday to Friday, as below. Apologies for the confusion over some Bubbles having had an earlier time on their confirmation letter in May. The morning school times, to ensure our social distancing, are:

Thank you to everyone for working to maintain distancing as expected. It is really important that parents stick to the arrival time you have been given for your child's Bubble. For Bubbles 4-11, please wait for a member of staff to direct you to the Nursery gate entrance each day, before you travel through the school grounds. If there is not a member of staff there, you must wait until they direct you. This is to ensure the spaces are clear at differing points on the school grounds.

Children who attend Bubble One (Rainbows) may walk directly to the red gate area and walk to the class at the 8.45am timeslot. Please enter the area via the central car park steps in order to keep to agreed pathways, avoiding using the grassy slope area.
